200TH ANNIVERSARY KICK-OFF

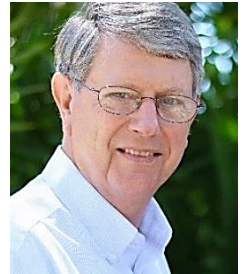

We turned out strong, ate heartily, and lingered to visit with one another at table. The surprise of the evening was the unveiling of coin banks made as a replica of First Presbyterian Church! We thank Chuck and Sue Fienning and Sumter Packaging for donating these wonderful keepsakes to our 200th anniversary celebration. Some of the banks are solid white so that they can be colored and decorated by our children and others. Other coin banks are printed and wrapped in a photo of our actual church! They are amazing, and we will use them to collect our monies for a significant gift that we are hoping to give to our community as part of our year of celebration. These coin banks are available in the hallway outside the fellowship hall, and we hope that you will pick one up soon. What a perfect way to kick off our thanksgiving for First Presbyterian.

Our celebration will gain momentum on Sunday, February 12, as we highlight the international mission of our church through the years. Rev. John McCall, whom we have supported for many years as a Presbyterian mission co-worker in Taiwan, will be with us for a youth breakfast at 9:00 am, our morning worship service at 10:30 am, and a congregational dinner afterwards. The dinner is being provided by the Missions Committee as they bring us delicious food from around the world. There is no cost for this meal, but please call the church office or sign up in the office hallway to let us know you are coming to this special gathering.

I first met the Rev. John McCall when he was pastor of the Black Mountain Presbyterian Church in Black Mountain, North Carolina. We were members of a small group of pastors who met each year to work on our preaching and to support one another in our ministry for Jesus Christ. It was during this time that John felt a strong call to serve Christ in international missions. He left his American pulpit, learned Mandarin Chinese, and devoted his life to training Taiwanese pastors and encouraging them in their ministries for our Lord. At one point John returned to the United States to be near his family and to pastor the Westminster Presbyterian Church in Greensboro, North Carolina. But the strong call to the Taiwanese Christians would not go away, and he returned to Taiwan for another time of service. My friendship with John was strengthened when I visited him and toured his mission work in Taiwan just a few years ago. Then John McCall came to St. Simons Island to help retire me from active ministry in 2018. It is a joy to have him return to Sumter during my time as pastor here.

Another treat is coming our way soon as we welcome Rev. Joel Long to our pulpit on Sunday, February 5. Joel and Ann are looking forward to worshipping with us. Good things are coming in bunches this year!

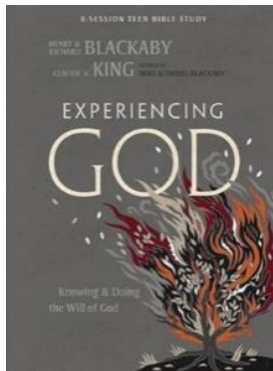

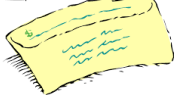
